About HMS

Thinking critically, acting globally and making connections across disciplines. Persisting through problem solving. Working on teams and independently. Hudson Montessori students practice these skills at a young age. In our close-knit community, students are known and learn at their own pace. Challenged to achieve their personal best, students leave well-prepared for meaningful lives and responsible global citizenship.

Campus

Our campus just north of Hudson, Ohio is designed to be child-friendly and to inspire young minds to discover the world around them firsthand. Our school is situated on 12-acres, equipped with an indoor gymnasium and a contained playground area with age-appropriate equipment. Our enclosed back woods feature additional outdoor enrichment opportunities. We are also fortunate to be located close to off-campus attractions and parks.

HMS Summer Staff

All of our programs are staffed by talented and dedicated camp counselors and staff who are passionate about working with children -- many of whom are also HMS faculty, staff, or alumni. Our summer staff also receives first aid and CPR/AED training and exposure. Enrichment Camps are staffed independently by leaders in their respective fields that inspire children to create, discover, and explore the world around them.

Arrival & Dismissal

Detailed instructions will be sent via email as the start of each camp approaches. Staff and signage will also be available to guide students to their respective camps. Each camper should be picked up by a parent or adult listed as approved on their release form for pick-up. If a counselor is not familiar with the person picking up the camper, they may be asked to provide a photo ID before the child is released.

Schedule Flexibility with Before Care and After Care

We offer the option of adding before care (7:30am to beginning of camp in morning) or after care (end of camp in the afternoon -5:30pm) if applicable to that camp. As a result, we can accommodate campers from as early as 7:30am until as late as 5:30pm daily.

Lunch and Snack Time

All-day campers are to bring a healthy and nutritious lunch, beverage, and a snack. Half-day campers should bring a water bottle and snack. Unless otherwise noted in a camp's description, lunch is not provided by Hudson Montessori School. If a camper's programming extends beyond Noon, please plan to bring a packed lunch.

Returning for Summer 2026 - Registration online via Homeroom

We are excited to continue our partnership with Homeroom, a platform that specializes in solutions to manage summer camps and extended day programming. For you the parent, it has a user-friendly interface that will allow you to read camp descriptions, while browsing our offerings, during the registration process. Furthermore, once you register and pay for a camp, Homeroom will provide a calendar of the activities your family has signed up for, along with active receipts and record keeping (that can be accessed at anytime by you for tax purposes, etc). All families need to do is make a quick account with Homeroom, when prompted, during the registration process for summer camps at HMS. The platform will also help streamline our communications between HMS and you, our summer families. We will be able to send out group emails and texts to communicate any relevant updates to camp in real-time as needed during the summer.

Registration is on a first-come and first-served basis. Early registration is encouraged. All programs are subject to a minimum enrollment and cancellation if not met. In the event that a class is full or cancelled, parents will be notified as soon as possible. Registration forms, medical release forms, and waivers are available on our website. Registration is online at HudsonMontessori.org/Summer.

Deposit & Refund Policy

A deposit of at least 50% of total camp fees is due at time of registration; remaining balance will be paid on May 15. The payment method, credit card or ACH, initially used will be charged automatically on those dates). Any registration that occurs after May 15 must be paid in full. If you need any accommodations or would like to look into another installment plan option, please contact Tim McQuait via email at camp@hudsonmontessori.org.

A refund must be requested prior to May 15. There is a \$50 non-refundable processing fee for each camp's cancellation on part of the parent. No refund is given for the the initial 50% deposit. If HMS cancels a camp, a full refund will be given. No refunds are given for a child who arrives late, leaves early, or comes to only a part of a session.

Transportation Available to/from HMS

We offer transportation within the Greater Hudson Area, including nearby towns in Summit, Portage, Cuyahoga, and Geuga counties. We hope this transportation gives families more flexibility by providing to/from travel to HMS. All campers who register for transportation receive free Before and After-Care. Not available for mid-day use; only in the morning and afternoon.

Create-Your-Day Camps

Create-Your-Day Camp offers the opportunity to learn new ideas and interact with your fellow campers on a daily basis. Each week has its own transformative theme designed with an emphasis on encouraging campers to step outside their comfort zone. Campers will be guided by our experienced staff through a Montessori-inspired curriculum. Full-day campers should bring a lunch, 1-2 snacks, and a water bottle. Homerooms for CYD camp hold a maximum of 20-25 campers with at least 3 staff per room.

For Ages 3 and Above! In the past, Create Your Day has provided a multitude of combinations for camp attendance ranging from as a little one-half day per week to full days all week long. Full-week campers will be given priority registration until April 15. After April 15, Registration will then be open to part-time (1-4 day) campers. Welcome to Camp Explore!

Camp Explore offers the opportunity for campers to discover the world around them, while also enjoying traditional camp favorites. Over the course of each week, campers will explore the rich history and culture of Northeast Ohio. Every week will have its own transformative theme meant to enlighten and illuminate a new aspect of our surrounding community.

In addition to exploring the new theme for each week, students will participate in traditional camp outings. The excursions will vary week-to-week like hiking, biking, wilderness skills, kayaking, and more among others in the Cuyahoga Valley National Park. Even when partaking on these adventures, the opportunity to engage the content never ends. Through the field trips and excursions, campers will be able to make further connections to the place they call home.

This camp is designed to build off the natural curiosity of our campers. Geared towards children ages 8 years and above, we want to fully capture what it is to be a native Ohioan while also enjoying the hallmarks of a traditional summer camp — all while staying in your backyard. Camp will be limited to 16 campers/week to foster an intimate learning environment.

Full-day campers should bring a lunch, 1-2 snacks, and a water bottle. Each week of Camp Explore comes with complimentary Before- and After-Care which allows students to arrive as early as 7:30am and be picked up as late as 5:30pm daily.

Camp Explore is led by Hudson Montessori School Upper Elementary teachers Wendy DeBroka, Lisa McGinnis, and Lisa Pierce, who spend the school year guiding curious 4th–6th graders in our Upper Elementary classrooms. They bring a love of experiential learning, local knowledge, and a whole lot of enthusiasm to every week. All summer staff are first aid and CPR/AED trained, so families can feel confident while campers focus on exploring, discovering, and having fun.

Camp Explore! — Weekly Themes

Wild Ohio June 15 - 19

Camp Explore will start its summer off by getting outside and exploring nature in our own backyard. We will learn about conservation and the role we can play in making our world a better place to live with those we share it with in the animal kingdom. Students will also dive into how our area was geographically formed and shaped by the elements. To better supplement and complement the experience, students will go on field trips to a local nature museum or science center, like the Akron Zoo or Lake Erie Nature and Science Center. We will also be sure to take advantage of our proximity to the Cuyahoga National Park by exploring trails observing nature.



Space & Beyond June 22 - 26

It's time to lift off into week two of Camp Explore with our focus being on space - the final frontier! Ohio is often remarked as being the birthplace of aviation, and we will explore the vital role Ohio still plays in field of space and exploration. We will plan on a visit to the Great Lakes Science Center and NASA Glenn's Visitor Center to see the current and future innovations going on in our very backyard that stretch beyond the stars. Students will be able to see hands-on exhibits and test the range of their imaginations on what the next quest into space could be — who knows? Maybe one of our campers will be the next astronaut to come from Ohio?



Ohio Uncovered July 6 - 10

Following our nation celebrating it's 250th birthday the previous weekend, it's fitting we focus this week on exploring local Ohio history. Ohio played a crucial role as early settlers looked to go west in search of Manifest Destiny. To supplement our dive into our roots, we will do a walking tour of Hudson to see historical sites in our own town. Hudson had many influential citizens and impact, including those like John Brown who made this town a key station on the Underground Railroad. We will visit Hale Farm to learn about early settlers while also learning about the Native Americans who first called this place home.



Camp Explore! — Weekly Themes

Water Works

July 13 - 17

Water will be the main focus this week as we dive into all the importance water plays in Northeast Ohio, both recreationally and as a cog in its development as a state. The Great Lakes made Cleveland a vital port as America grew, it was one of its most populous cities at one point. The Ohio and Erie Canal runs right through our county, and it connected Cleveland with the Ohio River as well. We will plan on kayaking this week to see the waterways that helped shape our communities. We will also plan to tour some ships like the USS Cod Submarine or SS Mather in Cleveland, in addition to taking in the sites along Lake Erie and in the CVNP.



Play, Think, & Rock


July 20 - 24

Junior Veterinary Camp



Junior Vet Camp is an in-depth first-time experience for elementary students exploring what it's like to help animals! We'll explore hospitalizing patients with your own stuffed animal and role-playing as stuffed animal surgeons. Campers will learn real-life skills like how to de-skunk a dog. New activities are added every year, and this year there will be activities about how we humanize animals. Campers will experience the camaraderie of being with other animal lovers their own age and will have the guidance of pre-veterinary students of Kent State University! We also partner with Red Rover's social-emotional reading program to build empathy for animals by reading selected stories as a group.

During each themed camp day, campers are guided through veterinary-inspired activities and crafts that will leave you feeling like nurturing caretakers and knowledgeable explorers. These include hallmark activities like skeleton scavenger hunt and making your own stethoscope. Campers will create a basis for learning future concepts in medicine and physics as we explore through freeplay and group activities. There are over 40 original and unique games and activities that can only be experienced at Junior Vet Camp and are replicated nowhere else.
